Introduction

1302-1529, but only 1348-1481 contain relevant material; one or two membranes, total length of complete rolls 254-1503 mm., width 182-315 mm. Mostly single column, but *Dona et Exennia* are usually in double columns from 1404-5 until 1416-7 and again in 1423-4. Income and expenses are divided into subsections according to subject matter. At first there is a separate line for each item, but in the 1390's accounts tend to group more than one payment in a single line, and this tendency appears sporadically thereafter (see 1414-5 and 1418-9). From 1442-3 there is a tendency towards continuous subsection paragraphs, and after 1450 these become usual.

Early terminal dates are variable, but until 1378 Ascension Day is most usual; other are:

1348-9 – Monday after Ascension

1349-50 – Michaelmas

1350-1 - Michaelmas to Monday after Ascension

1351-2 – Monday after Ascension

1354-5 - two rolls, with a change of Hostillar during the Octave of Easter

1358 - Ascension Day to Pentecost

1358-9 - Pentecost to Monday after Ascension

- 1360-1 Two rolls run from Monday after Ascension to Ascension Day, with a change of Hostillar at St. Cuthbert n September (4th September)
- 1367-71 Monday after Ascension
- 1373-5 unknown (see Textual Notes).

From 1378-1403 there is no fixed terminal date, though Monday after Ascension is common and there are clear indications of a two-term year. Other dates used are:

1379-80 - two rolls, with a change of Hostillar at Michaelmas

1381 – Monday after Ascension to Friday before Michaelmas (27th September)

1381-2 – Michaelmas

1382-4 - half-yearly accounts at Ascension and Michaelmas

1384-5 – Ascension Day

1387 – Monday after Ascension to Michaelmas

1387-8 – Michaelmas to Friday before St. Matthew (18th September)

1388-9 – Friday before St. Matthew

1389-90 – Friday before St. Matthew to Monday after Ascension

1391 – Monday after Ascension to Michaelmas

1391-3 - Michaelmas

1393-4 – Michaelmas to Monday after Ascension

1394-5 – Pentecost

- 1395-6 two rolls run from Pentecost to Monday after Ascension with a change of Hostillar at Michaelmas
- 1397-8 Pentecost to Monday after Ascension

1398-9 – Monday after Ascension to SS. Nereus and Achilleus (12th May)

1399-1400 – two rolls run from SS. Nereus and Achilleus to Pentecost, with a change of Hostillar at SS. Simon and Jude (28th October).

After 1403 the usual terminal date is Pentecost, with the following exceptions:

1405-15 – each year runs from Pentecost to Monday after Ascension, with a six-day gap before the beginning of the next account

1415-6 – Pentecost to Monday before Ascension

1442-3 – two accounts, with a change of Hostillar at Martinmas (11th November)

1448-50 – Ascension Day

1450-1 – two accounts, with a change of Hostillar at Martinmas.

The chief responsibility of the Hostillar was for the welfare of guests.¹ Because he derived part of his income from his lordship of the manor of Elvethall, which was in the parish of St. Oswald's Elvet, he makes a number of contributions to the parish Boy Bishop known as the 'Bishop of Elvet'.

Textual Notes

1361-2: Heading damaged but closing year legible; opening date from close of preceding account, and closing date is assumed also to be Ascension Day.
1363-4: Heading badly damaged, but Ascension Day visible as opening date. The year and closing date are established from the balance of this account, which is taken up as the opening balance of the account for the following year (see note for 1364-5).

- 1364-5: Heading damaged, but Ascension Day legible as the opening date; year and closing date are established by the closing balance of this account being taken up as the opening balance of the account that begins on Ascension Day 1365.
- 1369-70: Heading badly damaged, but opening date legible under u/v light. The total of arrears in this account is taken up as the opening total in the account for the following year (see note for 1370-1); closing date is assumed also to be the Monday before Pentecost. Subsection heading completely legible only under u/v light.
- 1370-1: Heading lost, but payment for William of Lumley's visit to Holy Island also appears in the Almoner's account for 1370-1, and Thomas of Corbridge's first mass, noted here, must have closely followed his ordination as priest on 14th December 1370 (see Bishop Hatfield's Register f. 109 v.). Opening and closing dates are assumed to be, as usual, the Monday before Pentecost.
- 1373-4: Heading lost. The Sergeant of the Manor of Elvet Hall in this account is Richard de Wodland, who was replaced during the year 1375-6. The last year for which arrears are mentioned in this account is 1373, so as this is not a duplicate of the surviving account for 1374-5 (on which see the following note), it must be the account for 1373-4. Terminal dates are unknown.
- 1374-5: Heading lost, but the closing balance here is taken up in the account opened in 1375 NOT FOUND CHECK THIS, and *Pensiones et Stipendia* are for only one year.
- 1376-7: Heading damaged, but opening and closing dates are Ascension Day, and closing year is '137*', but the closing balance of this account is taken up at the opening of the account for 1377-8.
- 1379-80: Heading damaged, but the opening date is a Friday in 1379 and the closing date Monday after Ascension; as the account clearly covers less than a whole year, the opening date is assumed to be the close of the preceding account.
- 1380-1: Heading and section heading lost, but the total of receipts taken up at the beginning of this account corresponds (with a discrepancy of one penny) to the total balance plus Exonerations for the account closed on 7th May 1380. The account is clearly for a full year, and the closing date is assumed to be the opening date of the account for 27^{th} May -29^{th} September 1381.
- 1383: Text from A (complete version); B (incomplete version) substantially identical.
- 1390-1: Text from A; B substantially identical.
- 1391: Draft with many corrections.
- 1394-5: Text from B (incomplete draft); for variant in A, see Textual Note.
- 1399-1400: Text from A; B substantially identical.
- 1411-2: Heading slightly damaged and closing year not legible, but the account is clearly for one year.
- 1418-9: Text from B; A substantially identical, but with items in a different order. Two columns, with 'Dona & exennia' in col. a and 'Pensiones & Stipendia' in col. b. The same layout also appears in the accounts for 1419-20 and 1420-1.
- 1446-7: Heading damaged, but opening and closing years legible, and closes at 'same feast'; this account takes up the balance of the account closed at Pentecost 1446, and the account for 1447-8 also begins at Pentecost.
- 1447-8: Text from A; B substantially identical.
- 1448-9: Terminal dates switch from Pentecost to Ascension. Text from A; B badly damaged, but substantially identical so far as legible.
- 1450-1: Account for one term only; closing date switches back to Pentecost.

- 1451-2: Text from A (complete version, with damaged heading); B (incomplete version with heading intact) is substantially identical for this entry.
- 1452-3: Heading lost, but this account takes up the balance of the account closed on 28th May 1452, while its closing balance is taken up at the beginning of the account that opens at Pentecost 1453.
- 1456-7: Heading damaged, but legible as 'Pentecost 145* to same feast 1457'; the account covers a single year.
- 1457-8: Heading damaged, but opening date is Pentecost, and this account takes up the closing balance of the account closed at Pentecost 1457; closing date from the opening of the following year's account.
- 1458-9: Text from B (draft on paper), where the item is deleted; it does not appear in A (fair copy on parchment). Further, see End Note.
- 1461-2: Heading damaged, but opening date is 'Pentecost 146*' and closing year is 1462; this account clearly covers one year, and its closing balance is taken up as the opening balance of the account that begins at Pentecost 1462.
- 1467-8: Text from A; B substantially identical.
- 1471-2: Heading damaged, but closing year and opening date at Pentecost are legible. The account covers one year, and the closing date is taken from the opening date of the account for 1472-3, which takes up the closing balance of this account.
- 1472-3: Text from A; B substantially identical.
- 1480-1: Heading damaged, but opening at Pentecost and closing year are legible. The account covers one year, and the closing date is assumed to be Pentecost, as is usual for this period.

End Notes

- 1355: This account covers a period of only slightly over a month, and provides evidence that by 1355 the Durham Almonry Bishop ceremony was held between the Sunday after Easter and Ascension day; cf. also the Hostillar's Account for 1405-6 and End Note.
- 1361-2: For Peter Cruder (or Crowder) see also the Bursar's accounts for 1358-9 and 1359-60; as the other payments to him are for performing at the Prior's manors (Bearpark and Pittington), this payment may also have been for a performance at one of those manors. The lutenist and his singing wife may be the same couple who appear in the Bursar's account for 1363-4, again performing at Bearpark.
- 1365-6: Thomas Rotour is otherwise unknown, and it is not certain that he was a performer, but the fact that this is an isolated gift suggests a one-off musical performance.
- 1376-7: The payment to Bartholomew Wright the wrestler is dated to 7th August 1376. It seems probable that he is also the Bartholomew for whose funeral the Hostillar pays in 1379; if so, his occupation was evidently a dangerous one. The word 'caritative' suggests that the priory was not under any obligation to pay for his funeral, and hence that he was probably not its employee – no such expression is used for the burial of Thomas Fatuus, the Prior's fool (see Bursar's account 1356-7, Prior's Expenses 1357).

- 1400-1: For the visit of the Banner of St. Cuthbert to Scotland in August 1400, see Bursar's account 1400-1, Feretrar's account 1400-1 and end notes to both. The names and identities of the four men who accompanied it are unknown.
- 1405-6: This entry appears self-contradictory because the sum has been mechanically repeated from the line above, although both are included in the total sum for the paragraph. The intended statement is clearly that there was no Almonry Bishop ceremony in this year because of the wars at that time which can only refer to Archbishop Scrope's rebellion in May 1405. Further, cf. the Chamberlain's account for 1404-5, where the Almonry Bishop payment is deleted, and Appendix D on the Boy Bishops at Durham.
- 1410-11: As John Horsley was evidently a secular knight, this can hardly have been a lecture about a well-known miracle, which would normally have been delivered by a monk, or a minstrel performance or dramatic *miraculum*, which would have been performed by someone of lower social status, so it seems most likely that he was paid for narrating a new miracle of which he had personal knowledge. However, there is no way of knowing whether his narrative was delivered in public or not, and we have not been able to identify him or his miracle, though Horsley was a fairly common Northumberland surname, and at least two John Horsleys of the right general period and status are known see W. Percy Hedley, *Northumberland Families*, Newcastle, 1968, I, 148, 219.
- 1427-8: For John Lokwod, see also the Bursar's account for 1433-4.
- 1434-5 (and following years): On the 'Bishop of Elvet', see Appendix D, on the Boy Bishops at Durham.
- 1458-9: The only two accounts for this year that include Almonry Bishop payments, those of the Hostillar and the Prior of Finchale, both have it cancelled, and there are no payments for the next two years. It seems probable that there was no Almonry Bishop of Durham during the period 1459-61; no account gives any reason for the abeyance of the custom, but the most likely explanation is probably civil war, which was imminent in the summer of 1459, was in progress with a Yorkist invasion in the summer of 1460, and was at its height in Durham in the summer of 1461, when the city was in Yorkist hands but was the object of an unsuccessful Lancastrian attack in which at least one local noble family, the Nevilles of Brancepeth, took part (see Jacob, *The Fifteenth Century*, 515-29). Curiously, payments to the 'Bishop of Elvet' in the Elvethall accounts continue during this period; perhaps the parish ceremony was on such a small scale that it could continue despite the disruptions of war.
- 1480-1: This payment is confirmed in the list of Boy Bishop payments received by the Feretrar in his account for 1480-1. It is the last payment of this kind from the Hostillar; from the next surviving account (1485-6) onwards, the Hostillar seems to have been excused from making this payment. Further, see Appendix D, on the Boy Bishops at Durham.
